

he Messolonghi Byron Society is a non-profit organization founded in 1991 in Messolonghi, Greece. Its mission is promoting scholarly and general understanding of Lord Byron's life and poetry as well as cultivating appreciation for other historical figures in the 19th-century international Philhellenic movement, idealists who, like Byron, gave their fortunes, talents, and lives for the cause of Greek Independence.

With gracious cooperation from the local people and authorities, the Greek and the International Byron Societies, and individual Byronists from around the world, the Messolonghi Byron Society has grown in size and prominence by organizing many local, national and international activities dedicated to the memory of the poet. Among these activities have been International Conferences, lectures, one-day sessions, staging of plays inside and outside Greece, participation in British and Greek festivals, competitions, cultural events involving speakers and groups from England and America, exchanges, hospitality to Byronists from around the world, and twinning of Messolonghi and Nottinghamshire schools.

In 2001 the society established a Messolonghi Byron Research Center that now, thanks to the generosity of the Mayor and Town Council, occupies the top floor of Byron House, a handsome stone replica of the house Byron occupied during the last months of his life. The Research Center houses a growing collection of over 3000 books, as well as prints and other artifacts devoted to Byron, Romanticism, and Philhellenism. This collection has been created almost entirely from the contributions of a worldwide community of Byronists, and the Research Center gratefully appreciates the donations that continue to make the collection grow in size and scholarly value.

- 17:00 -17:30 Following Byron's footsteps in Messolonghi. Wreath-laying ceremony at the monument newly renovated by the Messolonghi Byron Society, at the site where Byron breathed his last on 19 April 1824, and where the University of Athens dedicated a memorial column to Byron to commemorate the centennial of his death.
- 17:30 18:30 Visit at the House-Museum of the prominent statesman, diplomat, and historiographer of the Greek Revolution of 1821, Spyridon Trikoupis, who delivered Lord Byron's oration. In this house, his son Charilaos Trikoupis, spent his boyhood years. He became one of the greatest statesmen of modern Greece, a dominant figure during the second half of the 19th C., and seven times prime minister of Greece.
- 18:30 19:30 Visit to the Garden of the Heroes, stretching alongside the defensive walls of Messolonghi. A big memorial garden with many Monuments dedicated to Greek fighters and to Philhellenes who fought or fell during the sieges and the Exodus (sortie). At the center of the Garden of Heroes you will find the grave of Markos Botzaris as well as a statue of Lord Byron, underneath which are buried some of the poet's organs.

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> SUNDAY 21 May 2017

09:30 - 16:30 Departure by coach for a visit to Thermo the ancient capital of Aetolia 620 b.c, on the slopes of Panaitolikos mountain over looking the Trichonida Lake, the biggest lake in Greece. We'll visit the new Archaeological museum, the site with the Temple of Thermios Apollo, the agora, the Byzantine Monastery of Panagia Myrtias 11th century, and the shore of the Trichonida Lake, to walk along to enjoy the view. The excursion includes lunch and is guided by the Archaeologist Ms. Katerina Leontariti.

11:30- 13:00 Visit to the Salt works and to the Chapel of Panayia Finikias, the island Chapel dedicated to the Virgin of the Palms, where Byron used to ride at sunset from Messolonghi and where he fell ill under the heavy rain on 10 April 1824; to the archaeological site of ancient Plevron, named after the mythical hero Plevron. Plevron actually consists of two Homeric hillside towns with a beautiful view over the lonian Sea.

18:00- 20:00 Visit to Aetoliko. Walking tour of the picturesque island town visited twice by Byron in February 1824; to the Church of Archangels inside which there is a well which Byron saw. In the garden outside is the grave of Ali Pasha's wife Kyra Vassiliki. Visit to the Vasso Katraki museum situated at the eastern side of Aetoliko, the only art museum exclusively devoted to engravings in Greece and Europe. It houses over 500 works of Vasso Katraki, a distinguished woman painter, engraver, and political activist.

Lord Byron's memorial monument: On this spot was Christos Kapsalis' house in which Byron stayed from 5 of January until 19 of April 1824 when he breathed his last. Christos Kapsalis blew up his house the night of the Exodus of 10 April 1826 including wounded people, women and children in order not to be captured by the Turks. In 1924 the University of Athens honoured the centennial of Byron's death by erecting a commemorative marble column, work of the sculptor Antonios Sochos. The granit pavement, lighting, iron grillwork, gates, and garden have been completely renovated in May 2015 with funds offered by the Messolonghi Byron Society and Byronists from abroad.
